



Who is being surveyed? The GaDOE is surveying parents of students with disabilities throughout Georgia.

#### What will be done with the information collected?

GaDOE Division of Special Education will work collaboratively with Parent to Parent of Georgia (P2P), the statewide Parent Training Information Center, to identify needs in family involvement within the state and local districts based on statewide survey results.

Individual answers are kept confidential. Each response will be coded by a number – not a name.



#### Camp ZooAbility Lottery Sign Ups (Summer 2023)

WHAT: Camp ZooAbility is a week-long Day Camp based out of the Chattanooga Zoo in June and July for individuals ages 6 and older who have intellectual and/or physical disabilities, and siblings. Weeks are age specific. Daily activities include, but are not limited to: arts & crafts, Zoo exploration, animal enrichments, group activities, swimming, a grand finale talent show, and much more!

WHO: Individuals ages 6 and older who have intellectual and/or physical disabilities and their siblings. \*Please note: The Chattanooga Therapeutic Recreation Services Division is not staffed to support campers who are unable to control violent behavior, or who need significant help with toileting or dressing. Camp ZooAbility strives to have low camper/counselor ratios in order for all campers to be successful. However, we are currently not equipped with the staffing to provide 1:1 for all campers.

WHEN: Camp is Monday - Friday and each week is divided up by age group:

Week 1: (6 -12 yrs) June 19 - 23

Week 2: (13-21 yrs) June 26 - 30

Week 3: (22 yrs and up) July 10 - 14

TIME: 9am-2pm daily

#### How to Apply:

A lottery system of random selection will be utilized in order to ensure fair and equal opportunity to participate in camp this year. To add your camper's name to the list for randomized selection, you must contact Elaine with this info:

We will be collecting names from 2/17 - 3/5.

All names will then be submitted into the lottery system and all interested parties will be notified by 3/10 of lottery results.

## March 24th Assessment Day

#### **Entrance Criteria:**

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Completed high school credits necessary for graduation.
- Meet eligibility requirements for Vocational Rehabilitation.
- Have independent daily living skills.
- Maintain appropraite behavior and social skills in the workplace.
- Take direction from supervisors and change behavior.
- Be able to communicate effectively.
- Be able to pass a drug screen, felony check, and immunizations up to date.
- Have the desire and plan to work competitively in the community at the conclusion of the Project SEARCH program.
