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## 2022 GES Title I Fall Survey Fast Facts



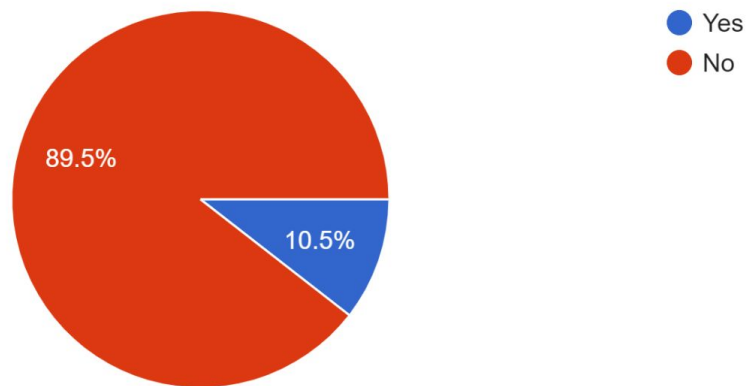
- Title I Fall Survey was made available to parents in two different manners

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## Title I Response

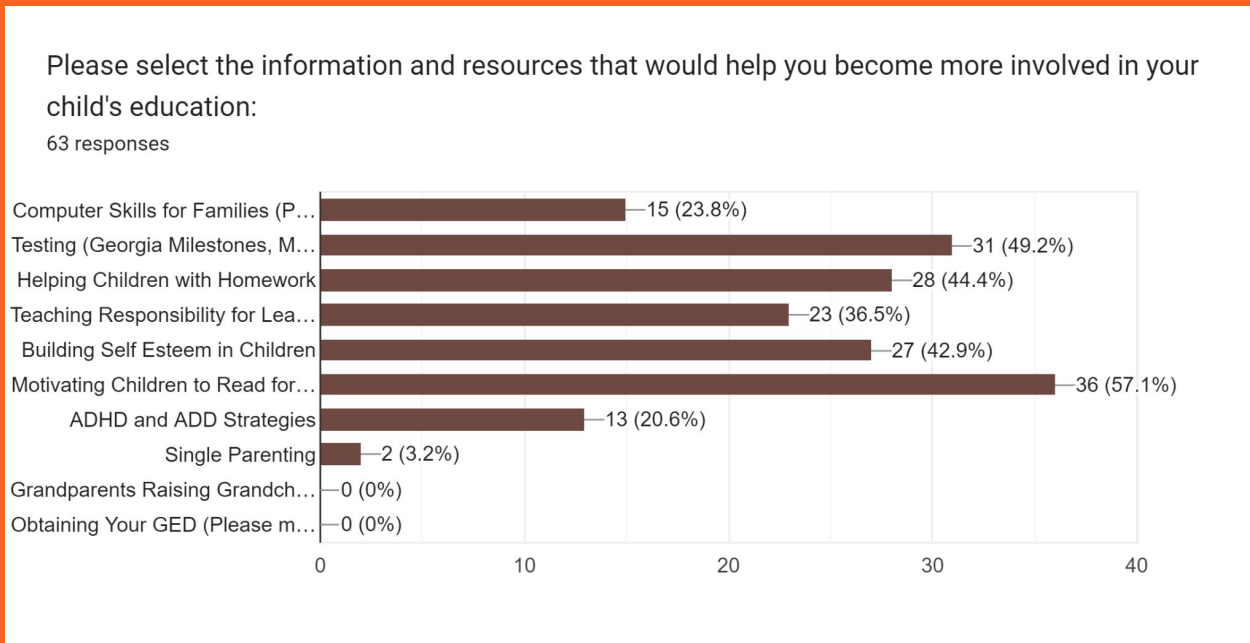

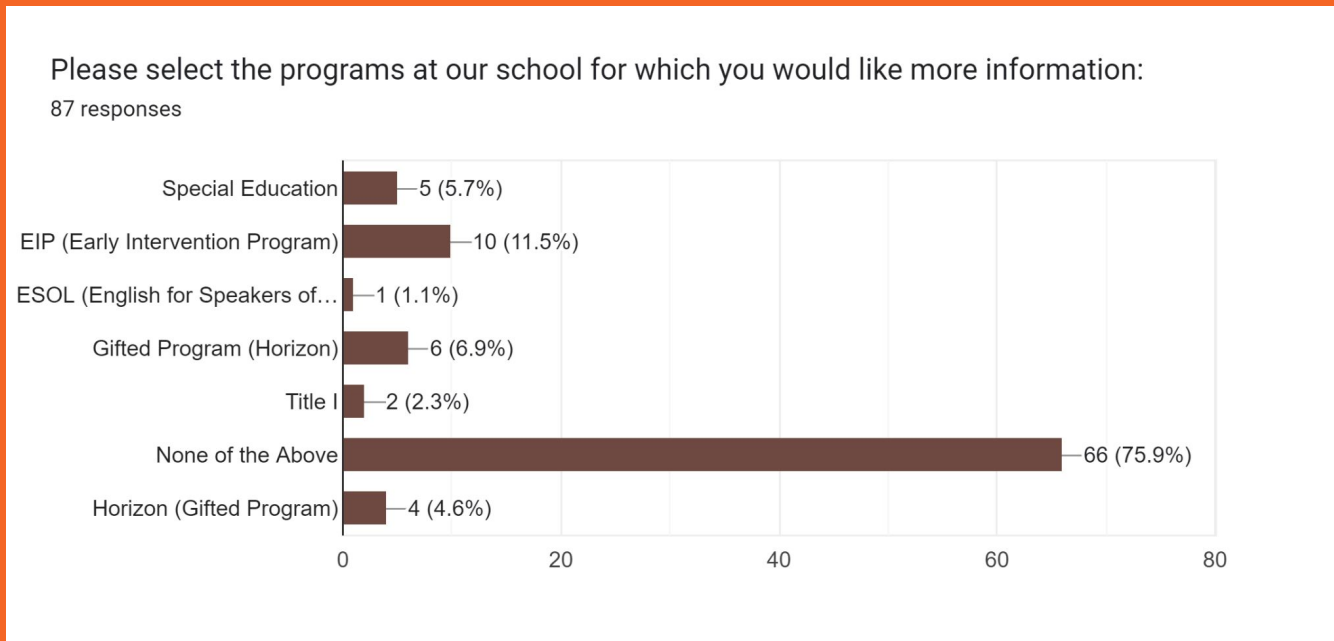

Parents who provided their contact information and requested additional information about school programs will have that information sent home through the Title I Parent Involvement Coordinator.

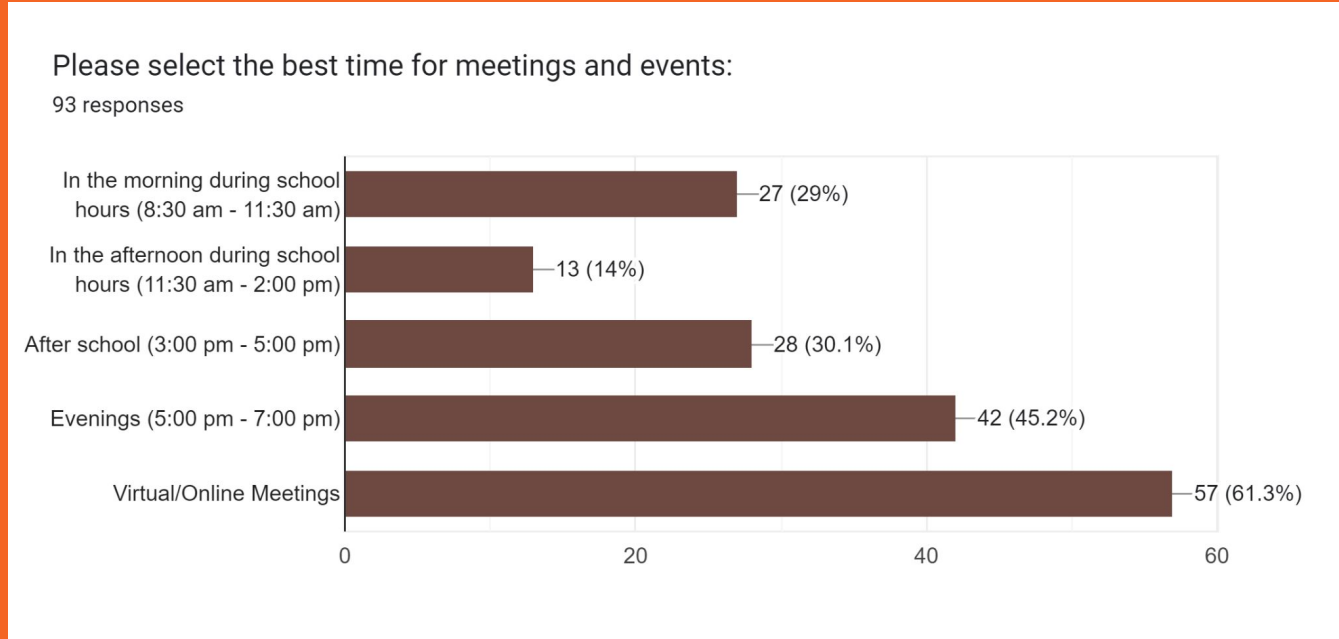

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# Title I Response

Title I offers a mix of online and in-person meeting throughout the year. We also attempt to hold the in-person meetings at flexible times to maximize the number of families able to participate.

Parent Volunteer Orientations are held during the school day, with one held in the morning and one in the afternoon. An online meeting was added this year to accommodate our parents who can not attend during the work day.

In-school events are mainly held in the evenings so that the majority of our parents can attend with their students, as this time is the most requested time on the survey.

Title I also began creating online meetings with our Georgia Milestones Virtual Meeting for Parents and our Virtual S.T.E.M. night in 2020 and, due to COVID mitigation strategies, all meeting in 2020-21 were held virtually. We will continue to offer online meetings when possible, as this seems to help parents participate at a time most convenient for them.

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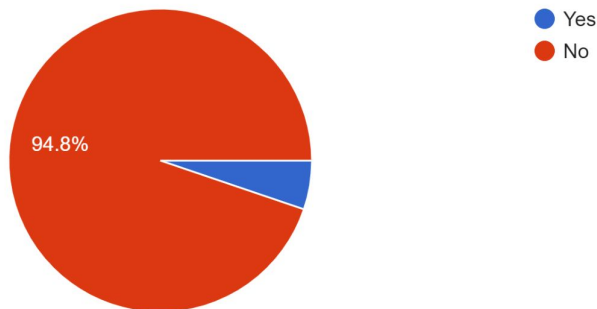

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## Title I Response

At the beginning and throughout the school year, Title I Parent Involvement works with classroom teachers, our ESOL teacher, and the office to identify families that would benefit from translated documents.

Title I Parent Involvement sends home a language survey to these families.

Once the preferred language is identified, Parent Involvement works with classroom teachers to make sure information sent home to parents is in a language they can comfortably understand. Online translators are used to interpret documents, newsletters, and other information in the identified languages. Instructions on how to view the website in a language other than English is also provided to our families.
